Reviewing the strategic directions taken by diverse professional regulatory bodies, business leaders and employers, it is apparent that the future is interdisciplinary. This lecture explores how the Higher Education sector needs to prepare graduates for a dynamic, changing world where problems are complex, inter-sectoral and 'wicked' by nature, and where problem solving, prioritization and networking are crucial to the success of groups and individuals, working in interconnected ways utilizing transferrable skills.
